**BARNER, MITCHELL AND HARRIS
NAMED PAC-10 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

WALNUT CREEK, Calif.--Running back **Kenjon Barner** of Oregon, safety **Lance Mitchell** of Oregon State and defensive back/punt returner **Cliff Harris** of Oregon have been named Pac-10 Players of the Week in football.

Barner, a sophomore from Riverside, Calif., carried the ball 17 times for a career-high 147 yards and four touchdowns covering 1, 25, 10 and 41 yards. He also added one reception for 60 yards and a touchdown in Oregon's 72-0 win over New Mexico. He posted 225 all-purpose yards in the games first 21:09 before taking the bench for the remainder of the game. Barner's five TDs tied a school record and he currently leads the nation in scoring (30.0 ppg). Oregon rolled up a school record 720 yards in the victory.

Mitchell, a junior from Pasadena, Calif., collected a career-high 18 tackles, the eighth most in Oregon State history, in the 30-21 loss to TCU. He also added his second career interception which set up the Beavers' first touchdown of the game.

Harris, a sophomore from Fresno, Calif., set a school record, and matched a Pac-10 record, with two punt returns for touchdowns that covered 61 and 64 yards respectively. The two other times that was accomplished in the Pac-10 was in 1965 by Mike Garret, USC vs. California; and 1954 by Sam Brown, UCLA vs. Stanford.

Also nominated for offensive player of the week honors were wide receiver **Juron Criner** of Arizona, running back **Cameron Marshall** of Arizona State, wide receiver **Keenan Allen** of California, quarterback **Andrew Luck** of Stanford and quarterback **Matt Barkley** of USC. Also nominated on defense were linebackers **Paul Vassallo** of Arizona, **Colin Parker** of Arizona State, **Mike Mohamed** of California, **Casey Matthews** of Oregon and **Max Bergen** of Stanford. Also nominated for special teams play were kickers **Thomas Weber** of Arizona State, **Kai Forbath** of UCLA and **Nico Grasu** of Washington State, and punt returners **Jeremy Ross** of California and **Ronald Johnson** of USC.

AROUND THE PAC-10: Pac-10 women's volleyball went 22-4 in non-conference action last week, including a big win for USC as it upset No. 4 Hawai'i in Honolulu. To date, Pac-10 volleyball has posted an impressive record of 42-13 (.764). . . . The NSCAA men's soccer rankings include a pair of Pac-10 teams with UCLA at No. 17 and California moving into the rankings to No. 19 after it defeated No. 20 Indiana and played to a scoreless tie vs. No. 18 Notre Dame.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

ARIZONA: Junior QB **Nick Foles** was an efficient 32-of-37 for 360 yards and a pair of TD passes. Sophomore QB **Matt Scott** also got into the action connecting on 5-of-7 through the air for 53 yards. The pair connected with ten different receivers, with seven receivers each hauling in at least three receptions. Junior WR **Juron Criner** topped all with 11 receptions for 187 yards and one TD. The 187 yards receiving are the 10th most in a single game in Arizona history. . . Junior LB **Paul Vassallo** led the Wildcat defense in a shutout of Toledo's offense, limiting the Rockets to 180 yards total offense. He posted a team-high 10 tackles. . . The 41-2 victory for the Wildcats was somewhat of rarity. The only time Arizona won a game by allowing just two points was when it defeated New Mexico State 18-2 in 1910.

ARIZONA STATE: The Sun Devils put up 54 points in their win over Portland State. It was the most points scored by Arizona State since it beat Temple 63-16 in the season opener on Sept. 1, 2005. . . Senior PK **Thomas Weber** hit a 52-yard field goal, one-yard short of his career-best 53-yarder he had vs. UCLA in 2007. He is now 3-3 from beyond 50 yards for his career. . . QB **Steve Threet's** 237 yards passing is the most by an ASU QB in the first game of a career. The previous best was 160 yards by Jeff Krohn at San Diego State in 2000. . . Sophomore RB **Cameron Marshall** carried the ball just four times, but rushed for 104 yards and three TDs - the most rushing touchdowns in a game by a Sun Devil since Dimitri Nance had three vs. California on Oct. 27, 2007. He wasn't the only Sun Devil to find the endzone three times Saturday night as freshman RB **Deantre Lewis** rushed for one TD and caught a pair of TD passes. . . Arizona State pushed their record to 49-15-1 (.754) in home openers, including 12 straight and 14 of their last 15.

CALIFORNIA: Junior TB **Shane Vereen** ran for two scores and caught a pass for a touchdown. He was one of five Pac-10 players last week to score at least three touchdowns, joining Oregon's Kenjon Barner (5 TDs), USC's Ronald Johnson (4), Arizona State's Deantre Lewis (3) and Cameron Marshall (3). . . Freshman WR **Keenan Allen** was impressive in his debut, catching four passes for 120 yards and a touchdown. He added another touchdown on an 18-yard run. . . California's defense limited UC Davis to 81 yards total offense (14 rushing, 67 passing). . With the win over UC Davis, coach **Jeff Tedford** passed Pappy Waldorf for the most coaching victories at Cal in the modern era with 68. Waldorf went 67-32-4 from 1947-56.

OREGON: The Ducks opened the season with a 72-0 victory over New Mexico. The point total tied the Autzen Stadium record the Ducks set in 1999 against Nevada. . . The Ducks set a team record with 720 yards. . . While Oregon sophomore RB **LaMichael James** was serving a one game suspension, sophomore RB **Kenjon Barner** got the starting nod against the Lobos and rushed for a career-high 147 yards and four touchdowns. He added another score with a 60-yard reception. All of that occurred in the first 21:09 of the game. . . Sophomore DB **Cliff Harris** returned a pair of punts for scores of 61 and 64 yards. Until Saturday's performance, no Duck has ever had two punt returns for touchdowns in a single game. It's only the third time that has been accomplished in the Pac-10 (Mike Garrett, USC vs. California in 1965; Sam Brown, UCLA vs. Stanford in 1954).

OREGON STATE: The Beaver secondary earned their stripes in the 30-21 loss to TCU as junior S **Lance Mitchell** posted a career-high 18 tackles and senior S **Suaesi Tuimaunei** recorded 14 tackles. . . In a Texas homecoming, the **Rodgers** brothers accounted for 150 of the team's 255 yards as junior RB **Jacquizz** rushed for 75 yards and one touchdown, while senior WR **James** matched him with 75 receiving yards and one touchdown. James also collected 210 all-purpose yards (ranks ninth nationally) as he added eight yards rushing, 13 yards on punt returns and 114 yards on kick returns. . . With this being an open weekend for the Bearvers, they'll play just three games in September, but two are against top 10 teams TCU and Boise State.

STANFORD: Sophomore QB **Andrew Luck** completed 17-of-23 passes for 316 yards (199 yards in the first quarter alone) and four touchdowns in the 52-17 win over Sacramento State. The four touchdown passes were a career high while the passing total was the second highest of his career. Included in his passing total was an 81-yarder to junior WR **Doug Baldwin**, which was the eighth longest touchdown pass in school history. . . In his first career start, junior LB **Max Bergen** led the Cardinal defense with eight tackles. Stanford limited Sacramento State to 167 yards of total offense (54 rushing, 113 passing). . . The Cardinal are now 12-2 at home over the last 14 games.

UCLA: Senior PK **Kai Forbath**, the reigning Lou Groza Award winner, posted another record-setting day in the 31-22 loss at Kansas State. He converted field goals of 44, 25 and 42 yards despite being questionable for the game and tied two NCAA records in the process. He now has 27 career games of at least two field goals (ties Kevin Butler, Georgia, 1981-84) and 13 of at least three field goals (ties Luis Zendejas, Arizona State, 1981-84). He has converted his last 40 straight field goal attempts inside 50 yards (his last such miss came on a 47-yard attempt in game six of the 2008 season at Oregon). His 75 field goals are just 12 shy of the NCAA record of 87. . . Sophomore P **Jeff Locke** added to the Bruins strong special teams play as he punted six times for a 45.7 yard average, which included three punts better than 50 yards, and three punts placed inside the 20-yard line.

USC: In the 49-36 win at Hawaii, senior WR **Ronald Johnson** returned three punts for 100 yards with an 89-yard touchdown (the longest by a Trojan since Curtis Conway's school record 96-yarder against Oregon in 1992). He also starred on offense, as he tied a USC single-game record by catching 3 TDs (13, 3 and 1 yards) among his seven overall receptions for 59 yards. He currently is tied for second nationally in scoring (24.0, second in the Pac-10), is fourth in punt returns (33.3, second in the Pac-10) and is tied for 24th in receptions (7.0, second in Pac-10). . . . Sophomore QB **Matt Barkley** completed 18-of-23 (78.3 percent) of his passes for 257 yards with a USC single-game record-tying five touchdowns. He is currently fourth nationally in passing efficiency (243.9, second in the Pac-10). . . . Junior RB **Marc Tyler** made the most of the first start of his career as he rushed for 154 yards on 17 carries (9.1 per carry). . . . With 524 yards of total offense vs. Hawaii, USC was one of six Pac-10 teams to rack up over 500 yards of total offense last week, joining Oregon (720 yards), Arizona State (553), Stanford (529), Arizona (518) and California (517).

WASHINGTON: Junior PK **Erik Folk** connected on a 54-yard field goal. He was one of three Pac-10 placekickers to hit from better than 50 yards in the opening weekend, joining Washington State's Nico Grasu (56-yarder) and Arizona State's Thomas Weber (52-yarder). . . . Senior QB **Jake Locker** connected on 20-of-37 for 266 yards and one touchdown. He spread out his completions to nine different receivers. His favorite target was junior WR **Jermaine Kearse**, who caught five passes for 108 yards. Locker was one of five Pac-10 quarterbacks to throw for at least 250 yards last week, joining Arizona's Nick Foles (360 yards), Stanford's Andrew Luck (316), California's Kevin Riley (258) and USC's Matt Barkley (257). . . . Senior LB **Mason Foster** led the Husky defense with 14 tackles, followed by senior safety **Nate Williams** with 12 tackles.

WASHINGTON STATE: Senior PK **Nico Grasu** connected on a career-long 56-yard FG vs. Oklahoma State. It was the sixth-longest in school history and longest since Rian Lindell booted a 57-yarder vs. Boise State in 1997. . . . Freshman WR **Marquess Wilson** posted big numbers in his debut, pulling in four passes for 108 yards and one touchdown. He was one of six Pac-10 receivers to collect 100 or more receiving yards in the season opener. Two were fellow freshmen in California's Allen Keenan (120 yards) and Arizona State's Deantre Lewis (100). . . . The Cougars will look to snap a 10-game losing streak as they host Montana State on Saturday. Washington State is 6-0 all-time against Montana State, having last defeated the Bobcats 53-28 in 2001.

PAC-10 COACHES PICK OREGON AS 2010 FAVORITE

PASADENA, Calif. -- Defending Pac-10 champion OREGON narrowly edges out USC as the choice to win the 2010 Pac-10 Conference football title in a preseason poll of West Coast media members who regularly cover the league. The Ducks were listed in the top spot by 15 of the 35 voters participating in the poll and are picked to win the league for the just the second time (also in 2001).

Oregon finished 8-1 in Conference play to win the league by two full games last season and earned its first appearance in the Rose Bowl since 1994. USC picked up 12 first-place votes and fell just three points behind the Ducks, equalling the second-closest voting since the preseason poll began in 1961. A record seven teams received at least one first-place vote in the balloting.

The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 26 of 49 previous polls, including nine of the last 10. Following are the results of the preseason media poll (points 10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1, first-place votes in parentheses):

POLL NOTES: Oregon snapped USC's hold on the top spot after the Trojans were the media's pick to win the league each of the last seven years ... The three-point edge Oregon has over USC in the 2010 poll equals the second-closest poll ever. USC was picked by two points to edge UCLA for the championship in 1989.

PAC-10 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS - 2010-11

A new four-year bowl cycle kicks in this season and the Pac-10 welcomes a new addition to the lineup. The Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio will feature the Pac-10's first selection after the Rose Bowl/BCS participant against an opponent from the Big 12 Conference. The Pacific-10 Conference has agreements with six bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl, which is the destination for the Pac-10 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-10 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game, which this year will be played in Glendale, Ariz., following the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. In addition to the Rose Bowl, Pac-10 bowl partners include the Valero Alamo Bowl, Bridgeport Education Holiday Bowl, Brut Sun Bowl, MAACO Bowl Las Vegas and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. Pac-10 bowl assignments are determined by the final Conference standings. If there is a tie for the Pac-10 championship, the head-to-head winner among the tied team shall be awarded the Conference's top bowl position. In the event of a tie for any position in the standings other than the championship, the selecting bowl may choose its participant from among the tied teams.
